CALL FOR ABSTRACTS

The seventh Satellite Symposium on Neuropsychological Rehabilitation will be held in Krakow, Poland, on 5th-6th July 2010, immediately following the International Neuropsychological Society Mid-Year Meeting, being held also in Krakow, Poland. The Annual General Meeting of **The Neuropsychological Rehabilitation Special Interest Group** of the WFNR will also be held during the Symposium.

This is a multidisciplinary Symposium incorporating Neuropsychology, Clinical Psychology, Occupational Therapy, Physiotherapy, Speech and Language Therapy, Social Work, Medicine and Nursing. The primary focus of the Symposium is rehabilitation of neuropsychological consequences of acquired brain impairment. Within this context, submissions in a wide range of topics are sought, including:

- Empirical studies evaluating treatment programs
 - Group studies
 - Single-subject designs/Case descriptions
- Technological applications and advances
- Theoretical models
- Interdisciplinary approaches
- Pharmacological interventions
- Development of assessment instruments
- Family and carer issues
- Service development and clinical initiatives
- Cultural issues
- Social policy
- Topic reviews

Abstracts must be in English, **limited to a maximum of 250 words**. Details of the format for abstracts are provided below. Note that there will be three presentation formats used at the conference and we will ask you to indicate your preferred format. They will be (a) oral presentation, (b) poster plus 5 minute oral presentation ('datablitz session') and (c) poster only. The idea of the datablitz session will be to give the opportunity for more participants to give a brief presentation of the main findings from their work. During the conference we will therefore have one or more datablitz sessions depending upon the number of submissions. When you submit the abstract please indicate your preferred method of presentation. Talks and posters will be published in "Brain Impairment".

Compulsory structure for abstracts

1. **Abstract title:**
